

Personalised Curriculum at Mary Rose Academy

CHILD	The curriculum at Mary Rose Academy aims to develop the whole child; their knowledge, skills, understanding and attitudes and is filled with rich, first hand, purposeful and engaging activities and experiences.
EHCP	The curriculum is entirely personalised and flexible to meet each individual pupil's needs and interests, based around their EHCP long term outcomes.
ANNUAL REVIEW	Personalised targets are reviewed and set for the year at Annual Review with parents/carers, in conjunction with other professionals i.e SaLT, in line with the long term outcomes on the EHCP.
KEY SKILLS	Key Skills (termly targets) are written, which work towards the annual review outcomes.
PERSONALISED PLANNING	Teachers produce a personalised curriculum plan every two weeks, where each pupil's curriculum 'diet' can be seen at a glance. Their personalised learning intentions are informed by 'Key Skills' targets.
CURRICULUM ORGANISATION	The curriculum is organised into five areas: English and Maths remain at the heart of the curriculum and are taught alongside 'Understanding our World', 'Creativity' and 'Skills for Life', which encompass all National Curriculum subjects. Sensory Integration and readiness for learning activities are used to support pupils.
CREATIVE CURRICULUM	A topic/project based approach ensures breadth and balance, introducing pupils to new experiences and knowledge within relevant contexts for learning. Teachers work together in departments to produce both a long term plan and a creative activities plan, to further support their personalised plans.
SAT VALUES	The Solent Academies Trust 'Values' underpin the curriculum and are embedded to ensure pupils' personal health and wellbeing, resilience and communication are continually developed alongside their personalised 'key skills' targets.
CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT	Outdoor learning, off-site activities, residentials, school council, special days, assemblies, team captains, performances, community celebrations, sports tournaments, after school clubs... further enrich the curriculum and offer numerous opportunities to develop and enhance pupils' progress and skills in all areas. Offsite activities include swimming, kayaking, horse-riding, climbing, archery and local community trips.
